(*) RESOLUTION 3

At its meeting held on September 13, 2018, the West Islip Board of Education voted to submit the following Amendment to Resolution 3 for inclusion in NYSSBA's 2018 Voting Delegates Guide – Proposed bylaw Amendments & Resolutions for the Annual Business Meeting.:

Note: Words in () parentheses are omitted and new language is underscored:

RESOLVED, that the New York State School Boards Association supports (legislation) <u>efforts</u> to improve school safety by <u>limiting or reducing unauthorized</u> access to guns in schools.

RATIONALE:

The Resolution, as written, directs NYSSBA to support all (legislation) that would seek to reduce any and all access to guns. This direction is overly broad and would cause NYSSBA to engage in debate and advocacy on gun control controversies that extend far beyond the school setting. NYSSBA's focus should be on reducing or limiting unauthorized access to guns on school grounds. The Amendment would enable NYSSBA to engage in efforts to limit the ability to bring guns onto the school campus, while acknowledging that individual school districts might wish to authorize the arming of school security personnel.

NOTE: Amendment to Resolution 3 appears on Page 9 of the Resolutions Book

(*) RESOLUTION 17

It is anticipated that an amendment will be put forward on the floor of the Business Meeting that would include retired peace officers in Resolution 17.

Note: New language is underscored.

RESOLVED, that the New York State School Boards Association supports legislation that would substantially increase the earning limitations for retired police and other law enforcement <u>and peace</u> officers who are serving as school resource or safety officers.

RATIONALE:

Some Long Island school districts have hired retired peace officers, including corrections officers, for school security. Peace officers are not law enforcement. This amendment would add peace officers to the call for increasing earning limitations for those that serve as school resource or safety officers.

PLEASE NOTE: The final edition of NYSSBA's "2018 Proposed Bylaw Amendments and Resolutions Book", to be sent by NYSSBA to member boards on September 28th, was distributed at the Resolutions Dinner. It contained 3 Amendments not previously taken up by N-SSBA's Executive Committee, but which were addressed by the dinner attendees.

(*) RESOLUTION 4

An Amendment to Resolution 4 on Page 10 of NYSSBA's "2018 Proposed Bylaw Amendments and Resolutions Book" would add "and also allow for extending the school year beyond the last Regents exams"

(*) RESOLUTION 11

An Amendment to Resolution 11 on Page 14 of NYSSBA's "2018 Proposed Bylaw Amendments and Resolutions Book" would add "and include prevention programs directed toward social, emotional development and mental health programs."

(*) RESOLUTION 19

This Resolution was not recommended for adoption by the NYSSBA Resolutions Committee and not supported by the N-SSBA Executive Committee. However, an Amendment has been submitted that would strike the Resolution in its entirety and replace it with the Amended Resolution found on Page 22 of NYSSBA's "2018 Proposed Bylaw Amendments and Resolutions Book"

In short, the Amended Resolution calls upon the New York State School Boards Association to take a leadership role in raising awareness and understanding of the importance of school district leaders taking action to address disproportionality in the education workforce and student outcomes.
